Effectiveness	The presentation includes all the pictures needed to understand the topic. Sequencing of Information	Information is organized in a clear, logical way. It is easy to anticipate the type of material that might be on the next slide. Originality	Presentation shows considerable originality and inventiveness. The content and ideas are presented in a unique and interesting way.	Presentation shows some originality and inventiveness. Use of Graphics	All graphics are attractive (size and colors) and they completely support the theme/content of the presentation.
